Cynthia Cirling or Stan Jones may be willing to present to the Committee an overview of small park design and how designs much different from the "gardenisque Nigle of Sobert can satisfy a broadler consistency of users.

the park is currently a suburban style garden - with a large central lawn area, and extensive mixed plant borden to the periphery. Overlaid upon this design is the remnants of the pre-park era of the landscape: filbert trees and several large bigleaf mapsle trees, which provide the tall canopy cover. The trees are mostly incorporate in the peripheral plant beds, Though some punctuate the lann area. The A path rircumvents the central lawn, and an "artistic" children's play area is "squeezed-in" to one side of the lawn. What is most important about the plantings is that many of thom are herbaceous perennials - requiring considerably more maintenance than wordy shrubs, and more effort of dirision, dead-heading, fertilizing etc. than the city has provided in the part. Such kinds of planting is uncommon in parks roundays - due to the high level of maintenance required. Secondly the plant beds are enormously deep- (eg., over 20 feet deep from the boundary in some places) and therefore are more difficult to maintain; take up alt of space that could be used for other uses; and currently provide feetile ground for illerit uses. The front edge of the park is relatively open, while the rear is selectively wooded and heavily textured with plantings - the tendency is to be drawn to the rear of the park, where the space is more intimate. The front open space is relatively unused - as here, users feel "on show " to the passers-by.

- a. Legalize, tax, regulate heroin, cocaine, marijuana, putting income back into enforcement and treatment programs
- b. Move phone booth (not currently operational) to corner of Whiteaker Public Safety Station
- c. Place cameras in park connected to video display terminals at police dispatch headquarters
- d. Provide receptacle for used hypodermic needles with Spanish and English signs
- e. Have a needle exchange in conjunction with social service agency
- f. Get the Eugene Mission more involved in working on the problems of Scobert Park
- g. Foster greater Whiteaker awareness of drug and alcohol problem
- h. Work for more mutual trust between residents and Public Safety officers
- i. Provide more publicity about the regular forums of discussion with law enforcement and neighborhood representatives
- j. Get quicker reaction to problems by Public Safety and Public Works departments
- k. Focus community policing on dealing specifically with chronic offenders
- 1. Figure out how to attract those who will use the park legitimately
- m. Provide a public statement from City or police officials that they will enforce the laws in the park
- n. Have Public Works employees patrol the park more

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
